DIRECTOR'S ORDER UNDER SECTION 157 OF THE *CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT*

This Director's Order was issued under Section 157(1) of the *Consumer Protection Act* (CPA) in response to, in the opinion of the Director, contraventions of the CPA. As mandated by Section 157(3) a person or publisher who is subject to an order under this section may appeal under Section 179.

Pursuant to Section 179, to appeal the order, the person must serve the Minister of Service Alberta with a notice of appeal within **thirty (30) days** after receiving the order. Please include your name, your address for service, details of the order being appealed and your reasons for appealing.

**ISSUE(S)**

The Alberta Motor Vehicle Industry Council (AMVIC) has identified the following issue during the course of an investigation.

Evidence is provided that Ian Nathan BUENAVENTURA and Sebastian JOHN doing business as Racer's Edge YYC are operating an unlicensed automotive repair business. The location for Racer's Edge YYC is at 1708 42 Avenue S.E. Calgary, Alberta.

The business is advertised online as Racer's Edge YYC and offers performance auto parts and service. The business is the subject of a consumer complaint.

The contraventions is as follows:

*Consumer Protection Act*

Section 104(1) – unlicensed business

**DIRECTOR'S ORDER**

That Ian Nathan BUENAVENTURA and Sebastian JOHN (dba Racer's Edge YYC) and any other employee, representative or agent, **immediately cease engaging in the automotive repair business** within the province of Alberta until properly licensed as per Section 104(1) of the *Consumer Protection Act* (CPA).

Ian Nathan BUENAVENTURA and Sebastian JOHN (dba Racer's Edge YYC), must immediately:

1. Cease the repair of all motor vehicles while unlicensed to do so under Section 104(1) of the *Consumer Protection Act*.
2. Remove all advertisements on any form of mass communication.

**NON COMPLIANCE WITH ORDER**

ANY PERSON WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH AN ORDER OF THE DIRECTOR UNDER SECTION 157 OF THE *CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT* CONTRAVENES THIS ACT AND IS GUILTY OF AN OFFENCE AND MAY BE PROSECUTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 163 OF THE *CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT*.

**REFUSAL, SUSPENSION, CANCELLATION, TERMS**

SECTION 127(b)(i) *CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT* STATES:

THE DIRECTOR MAY REFUSE TO ISSUE OR RENEW A LICENCE, MAY CANCEL OR SUSPEND A LICENCE AND MAY IMPOSE TERMS AND CONDITIONS ON A LICENCE FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

- (i) FAILS TO COMPLY WITH AN ORDER OF THE DIRECTOR UNDER SECTION 129 OR 157, UNLESS, IN THE CASE OF AN ORDER UNDER SECTION 129 OR 157, THE ORDER HAS BEEN STAYED.
