# ISSUE(S)

The Alberta Motor Vehicle Industry Council (AMVIC) has identified the following issue during the course of an investigation.

Bimini Holdings Ltd, Bay and Tool Centre, Bay & Tool Centre and Bay & Tool Calgary, is operating an unlicensed motor vehicle repair business, having operated with a licence that expired over three years prior to the date of this order, and advertises services for which it is not authorized to perform, in contravention of the following:

Consumer Protection Act

**Section 104(1)** 

**Automotive Business Regulation** 

Section 12(o)



#### **DIRECTOR'S ORDER**

That Bimini Holdings Ltd, Bay and Tool Centre, Bay & Tool Centre and Bay & Tool Calgary, Naughan SISODIYA and any other employee, representative or agent, <u>immediately cease engaging in a designated automotive business</u> within the province of Alberta until properly licensed as per Section 104(1) of the Consumer Protection Act (CPA).

Bimini Holdings Ltd, Bay and Tool Centre, Bay & Tool Centre and Bay & Tool Calgary, Naughan SISODIYA and any other employee, representative or agent, immediately cease offering automotive services that it is not authorized to perform until properly licensed to do so by Alberta Transportation.

Bimini Holdings Ltd, Bay and Tool Centre, Bay & Tool Centre and Bay & Tool Calgary, Naughan SISODIYA must immediately:

- 1. Cease all unlicensed, designated automotive business activity while unlicensed to do so under Section 104(1) of the *Consumer Protection Act*.
- 2. Remove all signage and advertising that offers unauthorized inspection activity until properly licensed with the regulator Alberta Transportation, to engage in this activity.

## NON COMPLIANCE WITH ORDER

ANY PERSON WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH AN ORDER OF THE DIRECTOR UNDER SECTION 157 OF THE CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT CONTRAVENES THIS ACT AND IS GUILTY OF AN OFFENCE AND MAY BE PROSECUTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 163 OF THE CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT.

# REFUSAL, SUSPENSION, CANCELLATION, TERMS

SECTION 127(b)(i) CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT STATES:

THE DIRECTOR MAY REFUSE TO ISSUE OR RENEW A LICENCE, MAY CANCEL OR SUSPEND A LICENCE AND MAY IMPOSE TERMS AND CONDITIONS ON A LICENCE FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

(i) FAILS TO COMPLY WITH AN ORDER OF THE DIRECTOR UNDER SECTION 129 OR 157, UNLESS, IN THE CASE OF AN ORDER UNDER SECTION 129 OR 157, THE ORDER HAS BEEN STAYED.
